WHAT IS ESOL?

English for Speakers of Other Languages (ESOL) programmes teach English to people whose first language is not English, but who live in an English-speaking country and require English to communicate in daily life.

GROWTH OF ESOL AT NAPIER CENTRAL SCHOOL

- 2017 4 students
- 2018 6 students
- 2019 20 students
- 2020 22 students
- 2021 22 students
- 2022 25 students

There are 6 times more children in the programme since 2017.

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

Migrant and former refugee students are entitled to ESOL funding for up to five years (20 terms). New Zealand-born students (of migrant or refugee parents) are eligible for up to three years (12 terms). Schools can decide at which year level to start a student's ESOL funding.

HOW DOES THIS SUPPORT HAPPEN AT NCS?

- We have a dedicated teacher aide, Debbie Bradley,
 who runs the programme from Monday to Thursday.
- Debbie and Carol create ESOL groups or individual support depending on the child's needs.
- Funded time is allocated to each child.
- Debbie and Carol create a timetable which is revisited when needed based on the needs of the students.
